“This year's competition has been intense, with applications from 24 different states from Alabama to Washington,” commented Vytas Kisieli, director of the competition. Eleven finalists were chosen by a panel of independent judges. Three winners earned the title of

401(k) Champion® for 2026, and eight received recognition as Honorable Mentions.

“Today we honor the inspirational stories of our three 401(k) Champions® for 2026,” said Kisieli:

Dr. Paras Khandhar, Vice-Chief of Pediatrics at Corewell Health and Associate Professor of Pediatrics at William Beaumont School of Medicine, shared this insight:

“I regularly meet with new residents, who have no idea about or sense of financial literacy, and it

makes my day to get them started on the way of prudently investing in their future. My passion is to help make financial literacy possible, ensure people understand the importance of having a retirement account, and help start and guide them on their path toward financial independence. I wholeheartedly believe that even small moves now, like learning how to open an account, taking advantage of a company match, etc., can have a profound butterfly effect for their future."

Thane Walton, Practice Management and Retirement executive for United Planners, was motivated to help others:
